ECOLOGY. For the article “Invasion success of vertebrates in Europe and North America,” by Jonathan M. Jeschke and David L. Strayer, which appeared in issue 20, May 17, 2005, of *Proc. Natl. Acad. Sci. USA* (**102**, 7198–7202; first published April 22, 2005; 10.1073/pnas.0501271102), the authors note two errors in the ratios of vertebrate introductions to human immigrants. On page 7200, right column, line 7 of the first full paragraph, “about one European vertebrate species was introduced to North America per 10,000 human immigrants” should read: “about one European vertebrate species was introduced to North America per 500,000 human immigrants.” In line 14 of the same paragraph, “Quantitatively, about one North American vertebrate species was introduced to Europe per 4,000 human immigrants” should read: “Quantitatively, about one North American vertebrate species was introduced to Europe per 200,000 human immigrants.” These corrections do not affect the conclusions of the article.
